1) Introduction of new committee members and overview of Committee.

New members, as well as existing members, introduced themselves as the committee currently has 6 new members. Mike welcomed all and hoped that as a committee we would continue to serve the Department as a resource for all personnel.

2) EHS Listserv topics, seeing and recognizing hazards in work area-Betsy Howe

Betsy provided the group with a handout providing insight on various ways to recognize hazards both singularly and within a group setting. The reference provided steps to follow after the recognition of the immediate hazard and prioritizing the consequence of the risk.

3) Road and field safety during harvest season conversations-Mike Livingston

Mike indicated he would send out a short safety message to the Department to highlighting seasonal items which were discussed. This is to include general driving and roadway safety during the harvest season and harvest equipment safety. TJ indicated with increased harvest activity the local deer population is also more frequently seen on the roadways as their normal routines are disrupted.

4) Coursework including a laboratory component and EHS online resources-Rebecca Cederberg

Rebecca provided safety training resources which are available for classes that include a laboratory section. She provided both UNL EHS resources and external resources. These resources could be incorporated into new and existing classes to provide students to enhance their understanding of general research and increase safety measures in these settings. She also mentioned that lab personnel should label and date disinfectants. A new SOP referencing certain compressed gases employed in laboratories is also available.
